CURRICULUM IMPLEMENTATION SUPPORT FOR TRAINING INSTITUTES (CISTI)





Sustainable Agriculture Tanzania (SAT), in collaboration with the Division of Agricultural Training and Research (DTR) of the Ministry of Agriculture (MoA) initiated the Curriculum Implementation Support for Training Institutes (CISTI) project in 2019. The project aim is to support the production of skilled personnel who can effectively meet the demands of Tanzania's agriculture sector, while also enhancing climate resilience and strengthening the livelihoods of smallholder farmers. Project Phase II focuses on the development and validation of teaching and learning materials such as compendiums, textbooks, and practical guidebooks to be used across all agricultural training institutes (ATI) and for farmers in the field. Additionally, it aims to strengthen human capacity by enhancing knowledge, skills, attitudes, competencies, and abilities in the ATIs, as well as improve the institutional capacity for the effective implementation of the new curricula at the ATIs, SAT Farmer Training Center and Department of Training and Research (MoA).
